 - Ensure you understand any vaccination and quarantine requirements related to COVID-19
- Required Travel Documentation
 - Passport
 - Passport is valid for more than 6 months past the end date of trip
 - Visa (if applicable)
- Medical and Travel Insurance
 - Travellers should review their individual coverage additional travelinsurance may have to be purchased
 - Ensure you have health coverage that will extend to cover any COVID-19 related illnesses while traveling
 - Employees and Academic Staff Ensure you have either purchased travel insurance that would cover quarantine and trip interruption costs or that your department/unit head is aware of the travel and has adequate funds to manage those costs should they arise
 - Students Ensure you have either purchased travel insurance that would cover quarantine and trip interruption costs or that you have adequate personal funds available to manage those costs should they arise

- Ensure you adhere to the vaccination requirements of your country of travel and are able to provide the appropriate proof of vaccination

 - Avoid protests and large demonstrations
- Situational Awareness
 - Pay attention to what is going on around you
 - Feeling uncomfortable or uneasy
 - Follow instincts and move on
 - Be cognizant of what is posted on social media

- o Destination awareness
 - Appropriate attire e.g., wearing camouflage
- Local customs and laws
 - You are subject to the laws of the host country Know them!
 - Check to see if there are restrictions on any type of dress/clothing. In some countries it is illegal to wear camouflage if you are not part of the military/police force.
 - Different degrees of punishments for crimes
 - Consumption of alcohol/cannabis is regulated differently outside of Canada
 - Entering or leaving Canada with Cannabis (https://www.canada.ca/en/services/health/campaigns/cannabis/ border.html)

- In country Communications
 - Set up a communications group on a platform like What's App to stayin communication with your group and leader

- Call home
 - \circ $\:$ If you said you were going to contact home, DO IT!

Travel Tips and Tools

- Passport protection/ID and insurance documents
 - \circ $\;$ Make copies, take a picture to take with you and leave with someone at home
 - <u>Travelling with medication</u> (https://travel.gc.ca/travelling/healthsafety/medication)

- Have the generic name for medications
- Cash and cards
 - Carry correct form currency
 - o Small denominations and limit amount of cash on person
 - Use credit cards when able to
 - Let your bank and credit card company know that are travelling **before** you leave Canada or they could freeze your accounts
 - \circ 1-800 numbers do not work from overseas!
- Personal Safety
 - o Don't flash cash or other expensive items
 - Keep a low profile
 - o Keep documents and money secure
 - Exercise caution and try to use ATMS during the day in public places
 - o Don't share hotel/room number information in public
 - Share itinerary with family/friends
 - Bring and use any required PPE
- Social Media
 - Limit who can see your account
 - Set accounts to private
 - Political or other sensitive content
 - Keep posts general and not too specific
 - Delay posting until have left the area
- No data or Wi-Fi access
 - Access previously opened email with emergency contact information
 - o Screen shot important information

 - Anti-diarrhea medication
 - Antihistamines Known or newly discovered allergies to foreign exposures
- Jet Lag
 - o Hydrate
 - Adjust to destination schedule

- Pack smart
 - Pack one outfit and essentials in carry-on
- Exchange currency prior to trip

- What they CAN do for you:
 - Contact friends and relatives on your behalf
 - Help during emergencies
 - Direct you towards information on local laws, regulations, cultural customs, and obtaining visas
 - Assist with medical emergencies
 - Replace passports and take citizenship applications
 - Try to ensure equitable treatment under local laws if you arearrested, and inform friends and family upon request
 - Notify next of kin regarding accidents or deaths
 - Locate missing persons
- What consular services CANNOT Do:
 - Provide legal advice
 - Post bail, pay fines or legal fees
 - Get you out of prison
 - Investigate a crime or death
 - Ask local authorities to give preferential treatment to Canadians
 - Pay your hotel, medical, travel or other expenses
 - Make travel arrangements
 - Compensate or reimburse you for delayed or cancelled travel
 - Store personal effects or search for lost items
 - Assist with job hunting
 - Help you find accommodation
 - Accept mail on your behalf
