<input type="checkbox"/> Entry and Departure Requirements – obtain proper documentation required to pass customs, immigration, and visa requirements in that country. <input type="checkbox"/> Prepare for Emergencies: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Obtain a University of Calgary Emergency Assistance Card and/or luggage handle wrap by contacting us at riskmgmt@ucalgary.ca – it will contain 24-hour assistance phone numbers. <input type="checkbox"/> Health Emergencies: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Keep a health emergency card on your person, written in the language of the country/area to which you are travelling (i.e., your name, language(s) that you speak, medical conditions, allergies, and emergency contact numbers). - Obtain information on medical services in that area, including how to obtain them. <input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Vaccinations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Ensure you adhere to the vaccination requirements of your country of travel and are able to provide the appropriate proof of vaccination. - Ensure your routine vaccinations are up to date. - Strongly consider the recommended vaccinations as well. - Go to a travel clinic for a consultation with a travel medicine specialist as they can provide advice regarding the communicable diseases in that country/area as well as how to prevent or mitigate those risks. 	<p>International SOS App -> Country -> Medical</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Emotional Support Programs</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Employees travelling abroad can access Lifeworks Employee and Family Assistance Program, 24 hours/365 days a year. - Students, Post-Docs, Interns, Externs and Volunteers can access International SOS programs 24 hours/365 days a year. 	<p>Employees/Academic Staff Members: LifeWorks Within Canada: 1-866-424-0699, Within United States: 1.888.509.5560 All other countries: 1.905.886.3605</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Tell the representative the name of your employer and what country you are calling from and request they call you back immediately, or at a time convenient for you. - Provide the representative with the telephone number where you can be reached. <p>Students, Post-Docs/Interns/Externs/ Volunteers: International SOS (Call Collect) - 1 (215) 354-5000</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Medications</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Check the regulations of your destination country regarding importation of your medications, as some drugs may be strictly prohibited (especially narcotics and psychotropics). - Travel with medications in original containers - Take extra with you in case your trip takes longer than expected. - Take a copy of your prescriptions. - You can arrange for a copy of your personal health record to take with you, including a letter from your doctor explaining your need to take those medications/

<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Bring a first aid kit</p>	
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Communications</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Set up a regular check-in process with someone at home or at the University. Ensure that they know how to contact the University for assistance, if you do not check in. - Review emergency services phone numbers in that country (i.e., what do they use for 9-1-1), and also how to dial into to the country as well as calling back to Canada. 	<p>International SOS App -> Country -> Travel -> Phone & Power</p>

<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Keep an extra copy of your critical documents:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Including passport and visa information, up-to-date vaccination documents, host country identification papers and any Embarkation Cards. Keep them in a different place than the originals in case the originals are lost. - Copy of your health/travel insurance. - Leave a copy of these documents, along with your planned itinerary, with family or friends. 	
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Cultural differences / tips</p>	<p>International SOS App -> Country -> Travel -> Cultural Tips</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Equipment - if you are bringing University equipment with you, please check with Supply Chain Management – Customs and Traffic – to determine if you need a bond to ensure that you can export the equipment and return it to Canada.</p>	
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>PPE - Review masking requirements for all modes of transportation as well as at destination. Consider bringing extra supplies (Ex. Masks, wipes, hand sanitizer etc.)</p>	
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>Attend a briefing – (required for all Undergraduate students or those going to High or Extreme Risk countries) – for all others it can be set up by your Department through UCalgary International Study Abroad or it can be done at department level).</p>	
<input type="checkbox"/>	<p>DO NOT take weapons, alcohol or medications/drugs not permitted in that country.</p>
